Methods of communication used: I decided to obtain the witness statement by discussing the incident with the witness over the telephone as this was the most efficient method with which to communicate with the witness.

Why each was the most effective method of communication: Taking the witness statement by telephone was the most appropriate method as the witness was not local and it would not have been economical to travel to the witness. I was also working to a tight deadline and it was useful to obtain the information I required over the phone rather than wait for a response to my correspondence and risk not hearing back in time.

I understand that it is important to choose the most effective and convenient means of communication with others involved in a matter. I advised that he had previously spoken with my however it would be very useful if we would be able to get a full Statement from him. confirmed that was fine and that he was happy to discuss this further.
confirmed that he had been driving along to turn left onto Terrace when he saw a vehicle in the junction indicating to turn left onto Road. Road confirmed that he therefore brought his vehicle to a stop in order to allow the vehicle to exit the junction.
confirmed that the vehicle was about 10 yards away from the junction and he was manoeuvring to the right slightly in order to get a larger turning circle to enable him to move onto Road.
I asked whether the vehicle was indicating and confirmed that he was indicating. I asked whether the vehicle was over the central reservation at all and confirmed that he may have been slightly over the central line.
confirmed that when the vehicle was around 2-3 yards before the give way line, he saw a red vehicle approach from behind the vehicle and it appeared to slow down. Said that the red car looked like it had mounted the kerb and sassumed that the red car was coming to a stop whilst it waited for the vehicle to complete the manoeuvre. However, at this point, the red car then proceeded to drive along the kerb and squeeze along the inside of the vehicle in what thought was an attempt to get round the vehicle.
