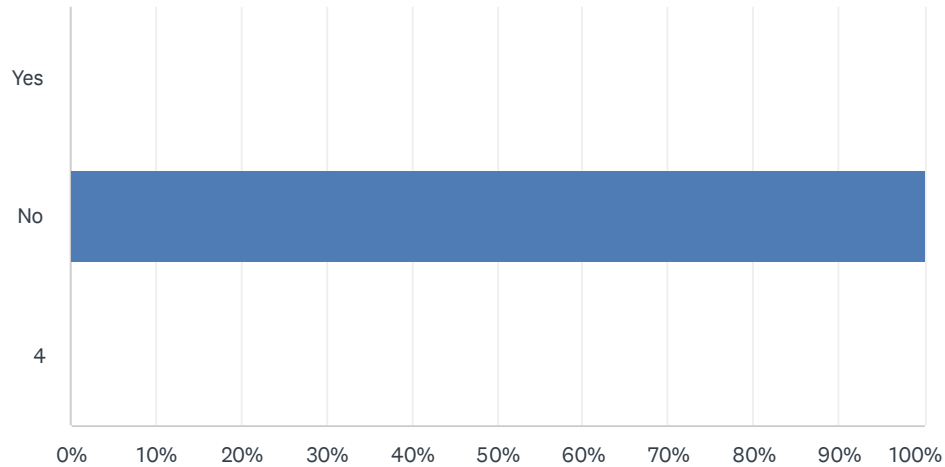


Q1 Do you consider it to be a priority to change the current regulatory system?

With the introduction of the revised education standards, the introduction of the CILEX CPQ and a change to CILEx membership levels there is a degree of fragmentation within the profession. It is pleasing to note that the number of practitioners has increased by 46% in the last 12 months (from 112 CILEX Practitioners in March 2022 to 164 CILEX Practitioners in March 2023) but this is still an area for growth. There are many competent CILEX professionals that, if assessed to gain those rights, could offer regulated services independently. 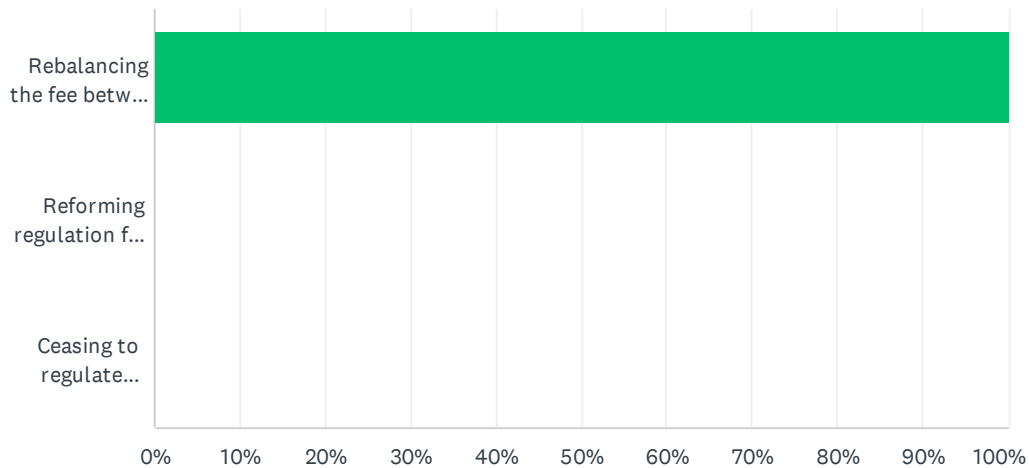

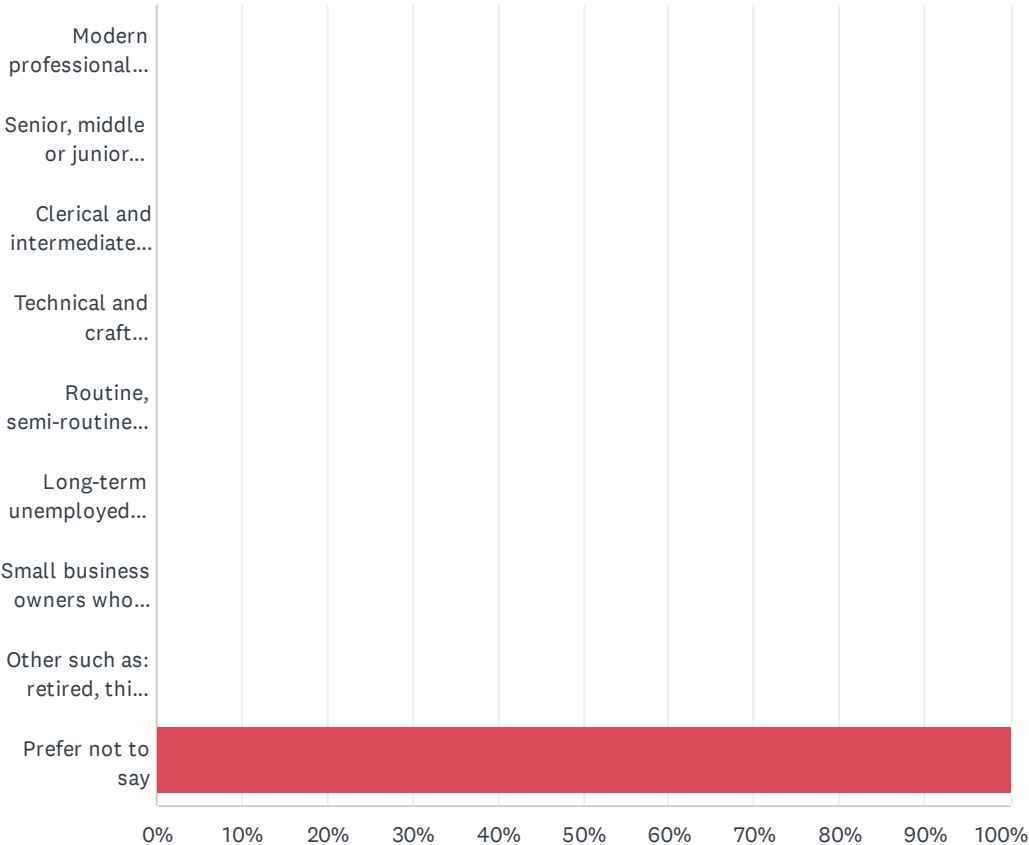
